



MAP YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD

Map Your Neighborhood (MYN) is a program designed to help neighborhoods prepare for disasters. At its core, it's about neighbors getting to know each other and learning which neighbors have needed skills and equipment after a disaster.

It's also about accounting for everyone in your neighborhood to make sure everyone is o.k. Washington State's Emergency Management Division has a great website to help you with this program at: <http://emd.wa.gov/myn/index.shtml>

Learn the 9 steps to take immediately after a disaster to secure your home and protect your neighborhood

- Create a neighborhood map identifying locations of natural gas and propane tanks
- Create a contact list that helps identify those with specific needs such as the elderly, disabled or children who may be home alone during certain hours of the day
- Identify skills and equipment each neighbor has that would be useful in effective disaster response
- Work together as a team to evaluate your neighborhood during the first hour following a disaster and take necessary actions
